Volunteer application forms are available at the circulation desk, reference desk or online at www.ptlibrary.org. Please complete and return this form to the library, where it will be evaluated by the library director.

A one-week minimum is required to process your application so that the library can fit your interests, experience and availability to the needed jobs. We are unable to assign volunteer hours on a “drop-in” basis. Because our priority for library staff is serving library patrons, volunteer hours must be scheduled in advance.
